

CIMPA Schools

Each CIMPA School offers a series of research-level courses taught by specialists in a field of mathematics.



Where do the CIMPA Schools take place?

In higher education and research institutions in developing countries.

What is the duration of a CIMPA School?

From 8 to 15 days.



Who are the CIMPA Schools aimed at?

Doctoral students and teacher-researchers.

How can one take part?

By registering on the School's local website.

How can one apply for financial assistance to take part in a CIMPA School?

By submitting a funding request for the school concerned via CIMPA's website.

What does CIMPA's financial support cover?

Travel and subsistence expenses for participants from neighbouring developing countries.



Who can organise a CIMPA School?

All School projects must be jointly undertaken by two administrative and scientific coordinators, one "local," affiliated with the institution that will be hosting the School and the other "external," affiliated with an institution located in one of CIMPA's partner countries.

How can a CIMPA School be organised?

By responding to the call for projects launched every year by CIMPA on its website.

What does CIMPA finance?

Part of the costs of organising the School and the participation of students and teacher-researchers from neighbouring developing countries.

CIMPA Courses

A CIMPA Course is a Master's-level or research-level mathematics course given by a visiting professor-researcher.



Where do the CIMPA Courses take place?

In higher education and research institutions in developing countries.

What is the duration of a CIMPA Course?

From 1 to 4 weeks.



Who are the CIMPA Courses aimed at?

Master's students, doctoral students, postdoctoral researchers and teacher-researchers.

How can one take part?

By contacting the local organiser of the CIMPA Course.



Who can organise a CIMPA Course?

Anyone who holds a post in a higher education and research institution in a developing country.

How can a CIMPA course be organised?

By responding to one of the two calls for projects launched each year by CIMPA on its website.

What does CIMPA finance?

The involvement of the teacher-researcher by covering his or her travel expenses (with some exceptions, accommodation and the costs of meals are covered by the host institution).

CIMPA Fellowships

The CIMPA Fellowships offer funding to enable young mathematical researchers to take part in short thematic programmes.



Where do the short thematic programmes take place?

In partner European research institutes.

What is the duration of a short thematic programme?

From 1 to 3 months.



Who are the CIMPA Fellowships aimed at?

Master's students, doctoral students, post-doctoral researchers and others, from developing countries.

How can one apply for funding?

By responding to the call for applications for the relevant programme on CIMPA's website.

What do the CIMPA Fellowships cover?

All the costs of taking part in the programme (travel, accommodation and meals).

From 1 to 3 weeks.

Master's students or students at the end of undergraduate studies.

How can one take part and apply for financial assistance?

By contacting the organisers of the school.

What does CIMPA's financial support cover?

Travel and subsistence expenses for participants from neighbouring developing countries.
