Zobo Vincent de Paul Ablé is from Ivory Coast. He is a specialist of Harmonic Analysis. He studied at the University Félix Houphouët-Boigny (Ivory Coast). He defended his thesis in 2019. His advisor was Prof. Justin Feuto and the title of his thesis is:

Espaces de Hardy-amalgames et étude de quelques opérateurs classiques.

He is currently lecturer at Félix Houphouët-Boigny (Ivory Coast).

Audace Dossou-Olory is from Benin. He is a specialist of Discrete Mathematics. He first studied at the University of Abomey-Calavi (Benin), then at Stellenbosch University (South Africa). He defended his thesis there in 2018. His advisor was Prof. Stephan Wagner. The title of the thesis is:
On the Inducibility of Rooted Trees.

He is currently lecturer at the University of Abomey-Calavi (Benin) and post-doc at the University of Johannesburg (South Africa).

The Ibni Prize was created in 2009 to honor the memory of Ibni Oumar Mahamat Saleh, mathematician and politician in Chad, in order to perpetuate his engagement to deliver a high quality training to young African mathematicians. The Ibni prize is now awarded by a scientific committee chosen jointly by the French mathematical societies and the Centre International de Mathématiques Pures et Appliquées (CIMPA). Every two years, one or two candidates are selected. The funds are raised by a subscription.
