The **Ibni's Prize** was created in 2009 to honor the memory of Ibni Oumar Mahamat Saleh, Malian and politician in Tchad, in order to perpetuate his engagement to deliver a high quality training to young African mathematicians.

The Ibni Prize is awarded by a scientific committee set up jointly by our learned societies and CIMPA, the International Center for Pure and Applied Mathematics.

One or two persons are awarded every two years.

The funds are raised by a subscription. The IBNI 2022 Prize is also supported by the Fondation des Sciences Mathématiques de Paris and by the Institut Denis Poisson.
