The **Ibni Prize** was created in 2009 to honor the memory of Ibni Oumar Mahamat Saleh, Mathematician and politician in Chad, in order to perpetuate his commitment to provide young African Mathematicians with high quality training.

The Ibni prize is now awarded by the CIMPA (the International Center of Pure and Applied Mathematics) and the Foundation of University of Orléans in France.

Every two years, one or two candidates are selected by a scientific committee, chosen jointly by the French mathematical societies. The funds are raised by subscription. More information on the application and selection process may be found at
